



From the Pastor's Pen

With election week finally at hand, there seems to be a great deal of anxiety abroad. I imagine you have felt it. Each political ad that casts the opposing candidate as a disaster who will bring the whole country to ruin adds to the anxiety. Some of the news, frankly, does cause me great concern, especially the threats of violence, ballot drop boxes set aflame and the racist, sexist comments demeaning whole groups of people. Here's a gentle reminder to take care of your mental health and take a brake from all the news if you sense your anxiety rising and especially if you might respond in anger or fear.

All of what is happening in our civic life compared to what we will hear in church this Sunday could not be more of a stark contrast! Our civic life is in turmoil with threats, accusations, outright lies, stoking of fears.



Join us Sunday as we celebrate our Blessed and Beloved Community of Faith that stretches across time and space, the followers of Jesus in every land, tongue and time, *The Communion of Saints*.

For all the Saints. . . your name, oh Jesus, be forever blest!

And join us Monday evening for whatever time you might to pray for our country and the community where God has placed us in time.



We pray often for our country and as this most contentious and close election draws near you are invited to come to church on Monday, November 4 to pray for our nation the evening before the election. Notes From Vicar Jessica

Beloveds -

In watching the news on any given day, we can see that all is not well. The collective trauma, death, and grief the world has faced in recent years are more than most can bear. And our personal losses at times feel insurmountable. The Gospel text for Sunday, the Raising of Lazarus, in all its complexities, hits at the heart of the human experience. Those who are familiar with the story know the ending where all is well. However, there is much we can learn from Martha, Mary, and Jesus as they were forced to face the death of someone they loved.

As Jesus encountered Martha and Mary's indignation, weeping, and the enormity of their grief, he was also deeply moved. The Greek words used for

Jesus's reaction are difficult to translate. Some translators suggest the closest interpretations as "shuddered, moved with the deepest emotions." Other translators offer interpretations of "groan, sigh, chafe," "troubled himself," or words that have a connotation of indignation. Whatever the translation, the anguish is palpable in this exchange. So moved in the face of human frailty, pain, and the death of a loved one, Jesus breaks down in tears. Jesus loved deeply (John 11:3, 5, 36) and just as deeply felt this loss.

It is in moments like this that we see the profound humanity of Jesus. He experienced the painful side of human emotion including the sting of disappointment and the anguish of loss.

We can find comfort in the knowledge that Jesus understands our pain because he has entered into our pain. We are not alone in our grief because he suffers with us.

How do you respond to a God that enters into our pain with us? Do you find this idea comforting? Challenging? Unbelievable?
