Bruce Onobrakpeya: The Mask and the Cross

Nigerian sculptor and printmaker Bruce Onobrakpeya began creating works depicting Christian iconography in 1966, when Catholic priests petitioned the artist to interpret the Passion of Christ. The resulting body of work is titled *Fourteen Stations of the Cross. Bruce Onobrakpeya: The Mask and the Cross* showcases the earliest of these commissions, from the late 1960s, on display through January 21 at the Smithsonian National Museum of African Art, 950 Independence Ave., SW, Washington, DC.

Update on 2025 Giving Intentions

Thanks to everyone who has responded to the call to share your plans to support Resurrection's proposed budget for 2025. To date, 26 congregation members and families have documented their giving intentions for the new year. In addition, 18 other families and members have transactions scheduled through the "Simply Giving" automatic funds transfer program that, as long as they are active, are acknowledged as commitments for next year as well. The total amount of these 44 giving intentions will cover 54 percent of the proposed budget for 2025. In addition, giving from donor-advised funds brings the percentage of the proposed budget covered by intended giving up to 57 percent. While that is an increase from this year, it is still well short of the goal of having at least 80 percent of proposed expenses covered by our intended giving by the time we vote on the proposed budget at our annual congregation meeting.

If you haven't yet provided an indication of how you and your family intend to support our shared ministries in 2025, there's still plenty of time to do so. Please prayerfully consider how you can help fulfill our plans for the new year and return a card with your giving intentions in the offering plate or mail it to the church office. You can also enroll in the "Simply Giving" program to have your offering automatically drawn from your bank account or charged to your credit card.
