
From the Pastor's Pen

Epiphany – a word from the Greek meaning "to reveal" or "to make known." It comes into our language to express a flash, insight, inspiration, realization, a vision.

The time following Epiphany, *right now* in the Sundays from Jan 6 until Ash Wednesday, features Bible readings centered on revealing the identity of Jesus. Each Sunday there is one "ah ha" moment after another.

The story of the Magi in Matthew chapter 2 ends the Christmas celebration and opens this time of discovery. The guiding of the star leads the Magi to the revelation of the Babe in Bethlehem.

We have heard the voice from heaven at the baptism of Jesus "you are my beloved." We will hear the voice from heaven again at the Transfiguration affirming "this is my beloved."



The Time After Epiphany is also a time to think about mission and outreach – "who is this Jesus" is often the question raised by those seeking or curious of the Christian faith. We answer such questions with these epiphanic scriptures and the witness of our own lives. We are called beloved. We are also called to invite others to be called beloved and join us to learn about this Jesus - this Jesus of amazement, of "ah ha" moments, and unconditional love.


