From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Church,

There is so much happening in our life together as a community of faith. This Sunday is the opportunity for us to come together to hear updates of the past year together, elect new leaders, thank those ending their terms for their service, ask questions, and vision the year ahead. We call this the *Annual Meeting*. Yes, the Annual Meeting is about business, but more importantly it is about ministry. What are our challenges and plans as we share the Good News. Do plan to be present this Sunday and participate in our work together!



Speaking of 'together' – I hope you have noticed we are including a sister ELCA congregation of our Potomac and Fairfax Conferences each Sunday in the Intercessions. We are not in this alone. God calls us into community. At a recent gathering of the clergy, we felt it important to be praying for one another to express our care for one another and our common calling.

"You're as welcome as the flowers in May!" This was a phrase a neighbor lady said often when I was growing up. I thought it a bit silly, but here in the depths of winter I am beginning to yearn for the flowers of spring. It reminds me that as we yearn for the coming of spring Jesus has called us to welcome all people with that same yearning and desire for the coming of spring. As you know, we are already welcoming as a congregation, but there is an intentionality of true welcome. We make ourselves available with time and an open heart. When we receive guests at home we offer refreshment, perhaps set another place at the table, spruce up the house and prepare a guest room.

When guests come to church, they are more likely to return when they have sensed that the welcome was genuine and intentional. The process of considering and becoming a **Reconciling in Christ** (RIC) partner congregation is to help us do just that – to be authentic and intentional to welcome people who have not always felt welcomed or that they could come and be authentic themselves.
