From the Pastor's Pen

In our scripture readings this Sunday we step backwards. February 2nd is 40 days after Christmas. According to the Law, 40 days after the birth of a child the parents were to present the child at the Temple. Since Feb 2nd falls on a Sunday this year, we observe the "Presentation of Our Lord." We step back into the days following the birth of Jesus.

It is an awesome moment! People came to the temple to encounter the presence of God in a special and saving way.

Mary and Joseph bring the presence of God in the 40-day-old baby Jesus into his own temple. The Spirit gives insight to two devoted saints of God, Anna and Simeon, who we meet. The saving presence of God "in the presence of all peoples" and for all peoples.

We come to our church building to encounter the presence of God in a wonderful, special and specific way. Certainly, God is everywhere but God is here in a saving way. We can be sure God is present for us, in the meal, in the Biblical readings, in our fellowship and in the proclamation of the Gospel.

Along with that, let me give a loving reminder that many like to have a few moments of prayer or meditation to prepare hearts for worship. So, remember when we greet one another before service to catch up with folks, please do so in the narthex (lobby) to keep a mediative atmosphere in the nave, the church proper.






